Each veteran was invited to attend an assembly in their honor, escorted into the auditorium to patriotic music, and thanked by students in various ways including speeches and songs. I listened as my children interviewed their grandfather who served in Vietnam. My children are proud of their grandfather, honored him through a personalized display, and escorted him into the assembly.
